- Compliance is 75% completed toward their goal with 3 months left in the FFY. If compliance conducts 67 inspections per month for the next 3 months, they will meet their goal. At this point, compliance has been averaging more than 67/month.
- Fatality rates were discussed. The fatalities were broken down into construction type (11 comm con/9 res con), counties (6 FAT/6 HAC/8 Other), and event type (5 struck-bys, 12 falls, 1 electrocution, 2 other/drownings). Everyone was reminded to continue to push construction inspections, as we are currently at the highest fatality rate since 2007, which was 24.
- SEP Counties for FFY 2019
 - High Activity Counties – Alamance, Brunswick, Buncombe, Cabarrus, Chatham, Cumberland, Davidson, Durham, Gaston, Johnston, Lincoln, Moore, New Hanover, Onslow, Orange, Pitt, and Union
 - Fatality Counties – Forsyth, Guilford, Iredell (will be HAC if no other fatalities occur during the rest of the FY), Mecklenburg, Robeson, Wake and Wilkes (based on the current number of fatalities)
 - Changes – Harnett County will be removed and Orange County will be added
- Beginning October 2018, there will be an excavation initiative within the SEP. Any excavation that is inspected in NC, regardless of the county, will count as an SEP inspection and should be coded as such.
- Supervisors will be emailed prior to October 1 to inform them of the FAT/HAC county changes and the excavation initiative.

General Discussion

- Jennie discussed the struck-by analysis. PSIM, specifically Karen Bogner, compiled the struck-by fatalities for the last 10 years. There were 147 total struck-by fatalities, 47 in construction. The fatalities were researched by the SEP committee for ones involving an operation in reverse. Of the 147 fatalities, 10 occurred while a piece of equipment was being operating in reverse, for an average of 1 per year. Virginia developed state specific reverse signal operation safety requirements in 2009 due to 30 fatalities in 16 years, with 9 fatalities occurring between 2005 and 2007. Kevin stated the feds are working on something on a national level, but that it would be years away.
- Jennie stated they are working re-establishing public forums/panels. Kevin reminded the committee the forums were added to the new 5-year strategic plan. Jennie requested Scott schedule a meeting with ETTA and CSB to go over responsibilities.
- Scott stated inspection goals were increased for FFY 2019 from 1000 to 1050.
- Kevin stated we are on pace to reach our goals but requested everyone to remain a presence on construction sites and thanked everyone for their efforts.
- Jennie informed the attendees Ted Hendrix will take over as team leader effective 10/1/18.

Jennie,

The partnership with Flatiron/Blythe is going well. Our last walkthrough was on April 12th. In attendance was Dawn Reynold and Jermaine Dennis with Compliance, Lee McKinney and Lori Kees with Consultative Services and Michelle Evans with the Star Program. At that time, the status of the project was the following:

- **Concourse Expansion:**
The paving of the concourse has been completed. Noise levels were taken and flaggers are wearing hearing protection. Storm water pipe is being laid. Trench boxes are being used and confined space permits implemented. Traffic control is used to cross the taxiway. Water trucks are used for dust control.
- **Elevated Roadway:**
Phase III will include opening the second elevated roadway. The bridge to the departures will have to be removed. There are 11 columns and caps that have been completed and 32 remain. During July, girders should be set; drilling has been impeded due to rock and weather. There are East and West pedestrian tunnels. Hydraulic shoring is being used and tunnels are classified as confined spaces. Pile driving for the crane footing was observed and noise levels resulted in 97 dBA and higher. Lee McKinney obtained 4 hours of noise levels (see attached Workplace Measurement Summary report).

We were supposed to conducted a walkthrough on July 2nd at 7 pm, to observe setting of the girders but it was cancelled due to delivery of the girders being pushed back. Dawn sent an email to the Flatiron rep to let us know the proposed date and time in August so that we can conduct a walkthrough and observe the setting of the girders, which is also our next scheduled walkthrough.

Also, the project was supposed to be completed in July, 2018, but due to problems with rock drilling for the shafts, and work on the five crane footings, work has been extended until December or January 2019. Dawn will present this information to Management to see how we need to proceed with the Partnership.

- Rob asked if Jennie would speak to their encounter the previous week. Jennie explained the inspection she and a trainee went to open, but found CSB on site.
- Lee asked questions related to the conduct of the blitzes and CSBs involvement. Jennie stated any efforts of CSB will be separate from compliance. A brief group discussion on the blitzes followed.
- Nicole asked Paul to brief the group on the upcoming “Ted Talk”. Paul discussed the citation rate for general contractors on multi-employer work sites and stated he had requested Ted to put together a presentation to staff on how to cite general contractors. Ted added information as to the format of the training.
- Rob stated he will receive CSBs written construction materials from the feds shortly and if anyone would like some publications, he will provide them a few. Mark asked if the material is in Spanish and Rob stated yes.


