- Flatiron/Blythe Development Company – Future I-73/Piedmont Triad International/ Greensboro Eastern Loop: The compliance representative is Lisa Rayborn (Team Leader). No representative was available to provide an update.
- Fluor Enterprises, Inc. – DAPI US Project at the Novo Nordisk facility: The compliance representatives are Bill Allen (Team Leader) and Jacopo Wiggins. Gregory Greene (CSB) and Andy Sterlen (ETTA) provided the update. The inspections at the facility are going great with only very minor observations. The project is 20-30% complete. The next site visit is November 7.
- Flatiron/Blythe Development Company – Elevated roadway and concourse ramp at Charlotte /Douglas International Airport: The compliance representatives are Dawn Jarman (Team Leader) and Jermaine Dennis. No representative was available to provide an update.
- Turner Rodgers – Expansion of concourse A at Charlotte Douglas International Airport: The partnership is complete.

## **General Discussion**

- Ted stated that, as part of the new five-year strategic plan, they are working on re-establishing the public construction forums. As a status update, Scott stated that Marcy Collyer has been in contact with the AGC and is working on setting them up. Scott stated that the AGC will handle the logistics of the forums and OSH will provide the topics and speakers.
- Kevin reminded everyone that if CSB has an active survey with an employer, then compliance backs out. If the case is an accident/referral, CSB backs out.
- Kevin stated that FedOSHA has provided a \$1 million Susan Harwood grant to NC State University/University of Georgia/University of Tennessee to provide outreach training re: post-Hurricane Florence rebuild. Wanda Lagoe will be meeting with Wendy Laing (NCSU-IES) to provide our assistance. The project will be completed by March 2019.
- Ted read an email from Jeff McLaren asking for guidance. Jeff had received an email from Victoria Voight that questioned whether or not a CSHO can enter a construction site based solely on the presence of a tower or mobile crane. She claimed there needs to be a plain-sight hazard or the employer could challenge NCOSH's purpose for being there. Kevin stated that there is an NCGS that states that we must have SEPs to reduce accidents/fatalities.
- Ted provided the meeting schedule for 2019: January 10, April 11, July 11, and October 10. All meetings will begin at 10:00 am.
