Progress Towards FFY 2019 Goals

- **Compliance Inspections**- Goal for FFY 2019 - 48 inspections statewide
 - Compliance conducted **36** (75%) LTC compliance inspections Statewide.
 - By Districts
 - **10** compliance inspections (East) Raleigh: 10; Wilmington: 0
 - **26** compliance inspections (West) Ashville: 6; Charlotte: 12; W-S: 8
 - By discipline
 - Health officers: 22 compliance inspections
 - Safety officers: 14 compliance inspection
- **Consultative visits** - Goal for FFY 2019 - 40 visits statewide
 - Consultative Services conducted – **43** (**108%**) visits statewide
- **ETTA Training** - Goal for FFY 2019 - 2 training sessions
 - ETTA conducted – **2** (100%) training events conducted statewide

Compliance statewide has completed 36 LTC inspections for the year. We only need 12 more to reach our current goal of 48 before October 1, 2019. The breakdown above shows the number of LTC inspections from each office.

Consultative services have reached their goal of LTC visits with 43. The current goal for consultative is 40 visits per year.

ETTA has completed 2 LTC training sessions for the year, which is 100% of their goal of 2 sessions per year.

Upon review by the committee, the only change to the 2.2 Long Term Care FFY20 Doc is shifting the baseline years to 2013-2017 for which the average DART rate for those years is 3.7. At the moment, there are no proposed changes to the areas of emphasis.

The slight increase in rates for NC is due to an overall increase in all injuries (cases with days away from work, cases with job transfer or restriction, and other recordable injuries), but is not statistically significant.
- LTC element focus - Bloodborne, Exposure control plans
CFR 1910.1030(c)(1)(v): An employer, who is required to establish an Exposure Control Plan shall solicit input from non-managerial employees responsible for direct patient care who are potentially exposed to injuries from contaminated sharps in the identification, evaluation, and selection of effective engineering and work practice controls and shall document the solicitation in the Exposure Control Plan.
 - What is considered input?
 - What documentation is sufficient?
 - Non-managerial employees or employee?
 - Bloodborne directive CPL 02-02-069
 - A discussion was held on the bloodborne item above. Clarification of the standard was provided. Supplemental information was provided through use of the bloodborne CPL.
 - Future training exercises were discussed
- What you have found at your inspections? A discussion was held on the types of hazards identified on inspection sites.
