- Supreme Court opinion on OSHA's ETS2 stayed standards effective 1/13/22
- Decision in NC still pending on Healthcare COVID Standard (aka ETS1)

Nicole Brown- East Compliance Bureau

- Staffing
 - Newly hired HCO Trainee Alexander Lee, D10, resigned from his position, effective 1/21/22
 - District 10 currently have 2 employees (1 SCO in training and 1 SCO released)
 - Several staff in East Compliance have tested positive for COVID and/or had a family member test positive, which has resulted in them having to quarantine. HR is notified when staff is having to quarantine.
 - Admin conducting interviews today for the vacant Office Assistant position
- Training
 - OSH 100 training conducted 1/12/22 (all day)
 - Tech Writing training scheduled this week (1/19/22, all day)
- Non-Responders to the NCDOL Public Sector OSH Injury and Illness Surveys
 - Sent email to Legal Counsel for NC DHHS trying to get responses for 2 surveys; Mildred Rivera in PSIM was copied on the email, as well as the listed POC for NC DHHS, Lee Collins. They were given until 1/24/22 to provide the completed surveys

Paul Sullivan -West Compliance Bureau

- Personnel update
 - Current Status out of 56 CSHO positions (26 Health and 30 Safety).
 - **41 released CSHOs (73%)** – 21 Health (81%) and 20 Safety (65%)
 - HCO Kevin Cosgrove retired on January 3, 2022
 - SCO II Kirby Atwood is transferring to CSB effective 2/1/22.
 - **7 CSHO Trainees (13%)**

- SCO Arthur Richards, HCO Chris Bellis, and SCO Kevin Barnes should be the next CSHOs released on the first quarter of 2022. SCO Tracey Wolfe should not be far behind.
 - **8 vacancies (14%)**
 - We've recently had applicants from WA OSHA and Virgin Islands OSHA.
- Notable fatality cases where citations have recently been issued or are nearing completion:

CURRENT CASES (NOT YET ISSUED)

- **Jessie Lane's Landscaping & Trucking, Inc. (318226818)** – fatality where a dump truck driver was pinned between the bed of his truck and a skid steer. Two serious citations are pending for the lack of jobsite inspections and training, with a penalty of \$4200. The file has been approved by the BC.

PREVIOUSLY ISSUED FATALITIES

- **The Conlon Company (318224631)** – fatality where an employee was crushed when the UTV he was driving overturned. Two serious citations were issued on 1/13/2022, with a penalty of \$13,300.
- **Rowan Regional Medical Center (318226024)** – fatality where a Patient Access Specialist was infected with COVID and died. Three serious violations related to the lack of eye protection and N95 respirators when working with suspected or confirmed COVID patients (including one under the ETS) were issued on 12/16/2021, with a penalty of \$14,000.
- **Knapheide Truck Equipment Company Midsouth (318226644)** – fatality where a 26-year-old employee was asphyxiated after connecting his air supplied respirator to a nitrogen line. Citations for four serious violations and one NS violation for respirator and hazcom violations were issued 1/6/2022 with a penalty of \$13,125.
- **Hounds Ear Club, Inc. (318221348)** – fatality where an employee cleaning gutters from the roof fell 20 feet to his death. Citations for one WS and one S violation were issued 11/8/2021, with a total penalty of \$46,200k. The citations have been contested.

- **3M Company dba 3M Scott Fire and Safety (318223138)** – fatality where the HR employee was asphyxiated while transporting 200 pounds of dry ice in her personal vehicle after purchasing it at Harris Teeter with the company credit card. Citations for one willful serious, one serious, and one NS violation were issued on 11/24/2021, with a total proposed penalty of \$81k. An ISA was executed reclassifying the WS item to Serious with no change in penalty. Additional stipulations were included in the ISA. The citations are now final order.
- **31-W Insulation Company (318223740)** – fatality where a truck backed-up and ran over an employee who was loading product into the truck. Citations for three serious violations were issued on 11/29/2021, with a penalty of \$12,975. An ISA was executed in this case reducing the penalty to \$12,100. The case is closed.
- **S.M. Smith and Sons, Inc. (318220688)** – fatality where the operator of a Caterpillar compactor was ejected and killed when it rolled over. One serious citation was issued on 11/12/21 for not using a seat belt, with a \$4200 penalty. An ISA was executed in this case reducing the penalty to \$3780 in exchange for stipulations. The case is closed.
- **Waste Management of the Carolinas (318222080) and City of Winston-Salem (318222098)** – fatality where the Waste Management employee was struck and killed by a bulldozer operated by the City of WS at the Hanes Mill Road landfill. One GDC citation was issued on 12/6/2021 against the City of WS for not establishing and implementing methods to ensure pedestrian safety on the tipping floor, with a \$7000 penalty. An IC has been requested by the ER
