DISCUSSION:

On March 25, 1992 the North Carolina Division of Occupational Safety and Health adopted the 1991 Edition of the Code for Safety to Life from Fire in Buildings and Structures (Life Safety Code), National Fire Protection Standard 101, under the authority granted by North Carolina General Statute 95-131 and consistent with Section 18 of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970. The adoption of the Life Safety Code is intended to provide additional protection for employees and to assist in the inspection process.

ACTION:

This standard adoption is included in 13 NCAC Subchapter 7C of the North Carolina Administrative Code with an effective date of April 1, 1992. A copy of this ruling is attached.

**.0107 LIFE SAFETY CODE**

All places of employment shall be designed, constructed, maintained, and occupied in accordance with the standards set out in the 1991 edition of the Code for Safety to Life from Fire in Buildings and Structures, ANSI/NFPA 101, which is hereby incorporated by reference. This incorporation shall not include any subsequent editions or amendments to this code. Copies of this code may be obtained from the National Fire Protection Association, 1 Batterymarch Park, Quincy, Massachusetts 02269 for twenty-seven dollars and fifty cents (\$27.50). This rule supersedes any standards based on earlier editions of the Life Safety Code.
