**Compliance Update**

**Rob Maedje** opened the meeting- We are finally back to our monthly goal of 67-68 inspections per month. We started slow, but thanks to the CSHOs we are now on pace to hit our goal. Ideally, I would like us to have at least 10-15 inspections above our goal, to give us some breathing room when I re-run the numbers at the end of the year. Additionally, we need start making sure we are addressing heat related illnesses on construction sites.

**Open Discussion**

- Paul/Lee/Rob
  - Looking to organize a commercial construction blitz. The goal right now is to conduct it the last week in August and first week in September.
  - We need to have more OSH representation on commercial sites.
  - Rob Maedje will be sending out emails to all the supervisor to try and start organizing some teams. Making sure each team has a leader that is competent in commercial construction.
  - Possibly working with Kevin O'barr's group to assist.
- Rob
  - We are still seeing programmed planned construction inspections as program related. We need to make sure we are coding this right.
  - When going through the bubble sheet and determining whether or not a focused inspection applies. We need to remember that this is for the entire jobsite not just the single site location.

**Partnerships- Mark Rasdall, Buddy Amerson, and Ted Hendrix**

**Jacobs Engineering-** Mark Rasdall is the Team Leader. Team members include Kaye Thibodeaux, Todd Waller, Gregory Greene and James Washington. The project is the \$1.8 million mammalian cell culture plant for Fujifilm Disynth. The construction site is approximately 150 acres in Holly Springs (Wake

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County); the facility will be approximately one million square feet and once complete, will be the largest drug-manufacturing plant in North America. Did a walkthrough recently and took some Health Trainees. Was able to observe health related issues such as silica, ammonia, hex chrome, and welding. The outside of the building is 90% complete and the majority of the work is now on the interior. They have a lot of cranes on site and are looking to perform a lot of concrete work and roofing. They have over 2,000,000 hours worked and have a DART of 0. The site has an actual medical clinic on site and had 22 visits to it last month. They are addressing heat related health issues by providing misting tents, AC tents for lunch breaks, and ice water. Additionally, each sub-contractor is required to have a safety representative on site.

**Holder- CLT-** Buddy Amerson is the Team Leader. Team members include Nelson Edwards, Carl Burgette, Starsky Martin, and Tim Hogan. The overall project is a \$600 million terminal expansion at the Charlotte-Douglas International Airport. The project is being completed in phases with initial work beginning in 2019 and expected completion in 2025. The expansion will include doubling the interior lobby space, along with additional space for security lanes, ticketing and baggage claim. Additionally, a canopy will be added over a new eight-lane elevated roadway in front of the terminal lobby. The partnership (for phase 3) was signed in September 2021 and will be complete in 2023. Phase 3 involves the demolition/construction of the northern half of the terminal. No update

No new applications received for partnership program- but hoping for more- they are good for training. If we know of any contractors that may want to partner with us, please let him know.
