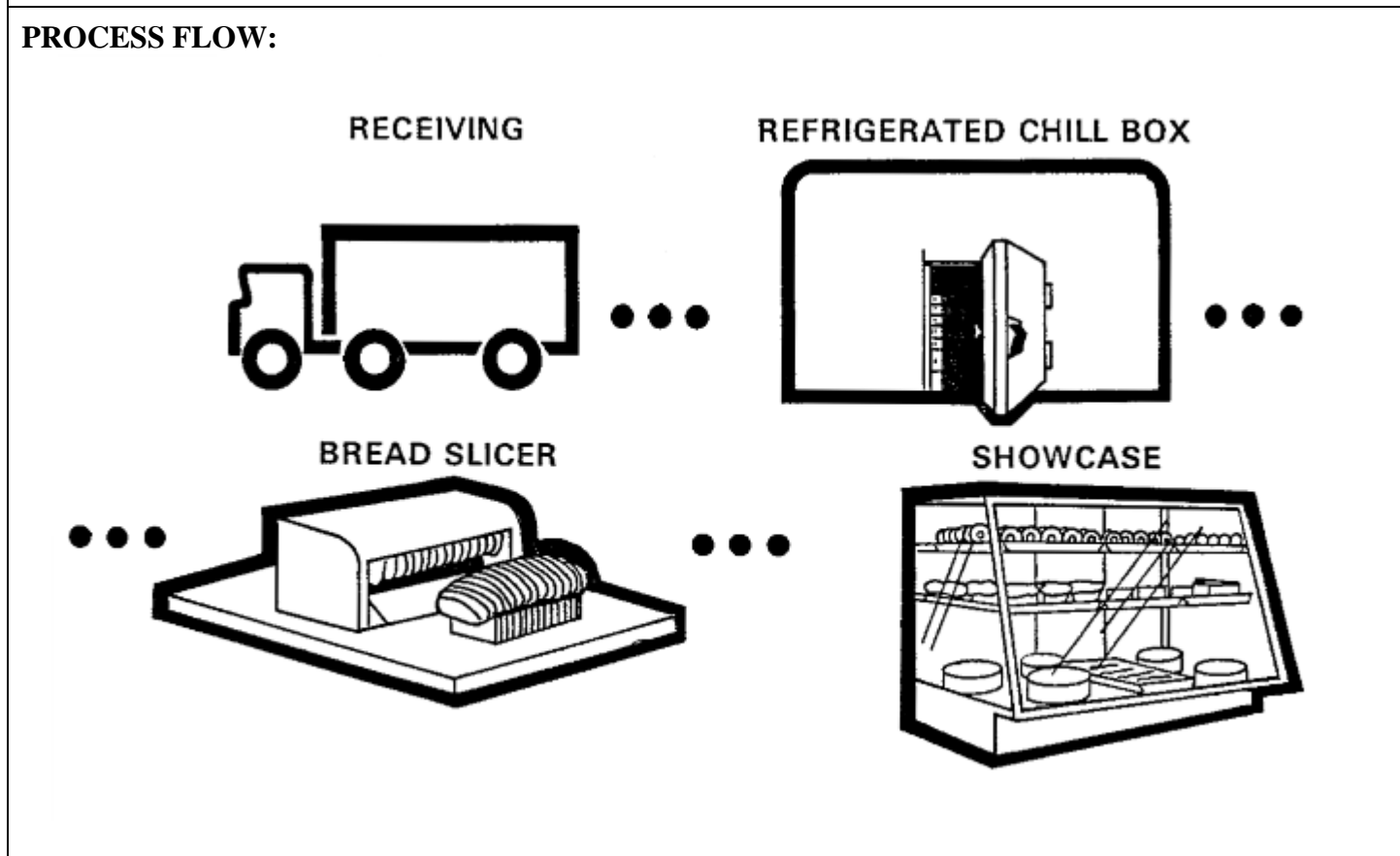

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PROCESS DESCRIPTION: The retail bake shop receives breads, rolls, cakes, pies, cookies, tarts, turnovers and other pastries from its own bakery or elsewhere. These items are displayed and/or stored in show cases, store windows, counter tops and refrigerated chill boxes. Powdered sugar may be used to freshen up the appearance of some items. A bread slicing machine may be in use.

Inspection Analysis					
<p>The inspection should begin at the receiving area by checking dockboards for anchoring devices. Floor and aisles must be clean and clear throughout. The two most commonly found pieces of equipment in a retail bakery that must be checked are the air compressor's V-belt drive and the bread slicer for blade guards and an interlock. All machinery and most appliances must be grounded throughout. Show cases must be checked for cracked glass and splintered wood. Also, fire extinguishers must be properly placed, recently examined and operable.</p>
